IWD on 8 March is a day where women and men come together around the world to celebrate the economic, political and social achievements of women.

UNIFEM IWD Breakfast

ver 550 women and **two men** (one of whom was the Minister for Foreign Affairs, Stephen Smith) enjoyed breakfast in the Hyatt Hotel Grand Ballroom to celebrate IWD at a special fundraising event to support Millennium Goal projects.

SIWA joined with the following prominent women's groups to host the function: Australian Federation of University Women (AFUW-WA); Australian Local Government Women's Association (ALGWA-WA); Business and Professional Women (BPW-WA); National Council of Women (NCW-WA); and Zonta International (WA).

It was a great achievement for the organising committee to secure the services of both the Hon Robyn McSweeney, Minister for Women's Interests, and Stephen Smith to officiate at the event and set the scene. The theme for IWD 2010 was to Empower Women to End Poverty by 2015, in support of the UN Millennium Goals.

Guest speakers were Dr Hamidah Marican and Elizabeth Shaw.

Dr Marican is the Executive Director of the Malaysian organisation Sisters in Islam (SIS) that seeks to promote an awareness of the true principles of Islam and strives towards creating a society that upholds the Islamic principles of equality, justice, freedom and dignity within a democratic state. Hamidah is a campaigner for women's rights and spoke about her work and experiences in addressing diversity issues. She recently battled the case of the caning and imprisonment of three women who were secretly convicted of adultery by the Malaysian Government and is constantly putting her life at risk through publicly seeking alternative options for interpretation of the Koran.

Relay for Life – Local Runners Last the Distance

Soroptimist Sunflowers took to the track again this year in the annual Relay for Life fundraiser for the Cancer Council. Now in its tenth year, the event relocated to the new WA Athletics Stadium after the demolition of Perry Lakes Stadium – and what a fabulous facility it is!

SI South Perth has been involved in the event since 2002 with club members selling raffle tickets and gaining sponsorship in the lead-up to the 24-hour marathon around the track.
